Low Dose CT Scan for Lung Cancer Screening 2021

Lung cancer is the second most common cancer and the leading cause of cancer death in the U.S. The risk of getting lung cancer increases with tobacco use and increased age. You may be able to receive a free Low Dose CT Lung Scan after consulting your primary care doctor.

Eligibility and Risk Factors

- Do you live within the El Camino Healthcare District? Verify patient address eligibility from these websites: <u>www.elcaminohealthcaredistrict.org/about/boundary-map</u> OR <u>https://eservices.sccgov.org/rov/?tab=dt</u>
- □ Are you uninsured or underinsured?
- Are you a current or former smoker with at least 20 "pack years"? For former smokers, quit date should be within the past 15 years.
- □ Are you between 50 and 80 years of age?
- Are you not experiencing any overt signs or symptoms of lung cancer? If you are experiencing symptoms, you may not be eligible.
- Undocumented immigrants, permanent residents (green card holders), and U.S. citizens are eligible to the program.
